Course Summary

Course Description	This course is primarily concerned with the questions of how human rights issues are discussed and dealt with within the framework of international law. By focusing on the diverse mechanisms and procedures for the protection of human rights, this course will provide principles and rules of international law for the protection of human rights in international society. Given that law can be served for the protection of human rights in a society, understanding the mechanisms for human rights protection under international law could provide a critical opportunity with the students to examine the nature of contemporary international society
Description Related Courses	This course is also related to the understanding of international law, international relations, international political economy.

Course Goals	This course will examine the diverse mechanisms and procedures for the protection of human rights under international law. The purpose of this course will provide critical foundations for the protection of human rights under contemporary international legal order, thereby providing a deeper understanding of the nature of international society.
Projected Results	Through this course, it is expected that the students will gain basic knowledge of the nature of international protection of human rights from the perspective of contemporary international law, so that they could cope with diverse international problems regarding the protection of human rights. This is critical in that the globalization phenomena of legalization have asked the students to gain intellectual power to cope with diverse international legal problems out of constant disputes and conflicts with regard to the human rights crises.
