Course Summary

Course Description	Movies and Languages (영상과언어) is a course designed for the analysis of the English I anguage in film. Emphasis will be placed on how movies represent the usage of English th rough different time periods involving various socioeconomic classes and ethnic groups a mong various regions across both the British and American cultural landscape. Specific u sages of the language that will be examined include variations in vocabulary, pronunciatio n, dialect, and idiomatic phrases. Films will be discussed in chronological order, divided b y specific periods in which they are set. Although not a requirement, students are encoura ged to view the films on their own time before class. However, it is understandable that not all students will have access to the films. Therefore, lessons will focus on the viewing of clips from the films that encapsulate the common language usage of the period in which th e film takes place. Additionally, explanations about language usage in the films will be pro
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	vided during the lecture in addition to group discussions that should help students make better sense of the context in which the language is used.
Description Related Courses	For the most part, students do not need to have prior technical knowledge of Movies and Languages to participate in this course. This class will consist of more than simple, straight-forward lectures. Although lectures are a component of the course, they will be integrated with discussions, activities, assignments, and group work. It is my job to effectively facilitate the learning experience in a way that promotes effective knowledge acquisition, and I will do my best to do so. Course Goals	Through active learning, students will be able to take an analytical approach to Movies and Languages by examining a variety of language usages from film as they relate to the British and American experience. The goal is to not only be able to distinguish between different aspects of language usage within the films, but to be able to apply those aspects to language usage in real life contexts.
Projected Results	By the end of the semester, students should be able to make a distinction between different usages of both American and British languages as depicted in film. Additionally, students should be able to make a connection between such usage and varying cultural contexts within both British and American culture. Furthermore, students should be able to apply such usage in real life situations.
Percentage of the original language classes(%)	For the most part, this course will be taught completely in English. This class uses English as the medium of instruction (EMI), so it is expected that the students taking this class are fluent English speakers. I understand that a majority of the students are not native English speakers, so I will do my best to communicate in a clear manner.
