Course Summary

Course Description	<p>The purpose of this course, College Writing 1, is to develop essential academic writing skills. This course is intended for students who possess an intermediate level or higher English skill proficiency. This course will be conducted fully in English and students will be expected to use English extensively in discussions and in their writing throughout the semester.</p> <p>College Writing 1 is designed to develop essential writing skills so that students will possess the ability to craft articulate academic essays with confidence. This course will instill students with an understanding of how to work through the writing process, and key principles that constitute clear and well-organized writing. This course will begin with an understanding of formal writing and review of foundational skills such as sentences and paragraphs and then progress to longer academic essays. Students will understand how to focus t</p>

	<p>their ideas by forming a clear thesis statement and work through the process of developing their idea further through research and logical organization. Throughout this course, students will gain an understanding of various rhetorical writing styles often encountered in college courses. Mindful that writing and reading are inextricably related, students will read and analyze different types of essays to help them develop the skills necessary to critically evaluate a text and to express and articulate their own ideas in writing. Students will also be encouraged to work together through collaborative learning to share and learn different perspectives to better understand their prospective audience and improve their writing approaches. By the end of the semester, students will be able to plan, research, and write a complete academic essay in English.</p>

Course Goals	<p>The primary goals of the course are as follows:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Students will be able to critically analyze a text to identify the main idea, key supporting points, challenge ideas, and locate and correct errors. 2. Students will understand and be able to identify the correct format and structure of academic paragraphs and essays. 3. Students will be able to develop a topic idea and write a complete paragraph or essay using the proper format and organization. 4. Students will develop peer editing and proofreading skills and learn to use feedback to improve their writing. 5. Students will be able to understand their potential audience and apply the proper tone and formality to their writing. 6. Students will be able to find and properly cite reliable sources of material to support their writing. 7. Students will develop their creativity and confidence in writing different rhetorical styles of academic essays.
Projected Results	<p>Upon completion of this course, students will have demonstrated their ability to write a refined academic essay that clearly expresses and supports their ideas in English. Students will also show that they are able to think critically to construct and produce original, well-organized writing on various issues and topics.</p>
