Course Description	Culture has become a major force in counseling, introducing new research and theory and, most significantly, new insights to help us understand individuals and relationships. We will engage in critical examination of some of the founding concepts of culture as well as contemporary events, using an intersectional approach to power and oppression. Cultural diversity will be addressed broadly, including but not limited to gender, race, ethnicity, immigration status, sexual identity, (dis)ability, religion, and trauma. While most of the concepts are coming from United States, we will keep in mind how this experience compares around the globe.
